SFNE Committee Descriptions

Education Committee

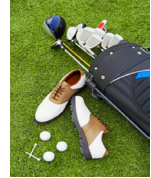


The SFNE Education Committee analyzes the membership's educational needs and makes recommendations for seminars to meet those specific needs. They will arrange for speakers and the distribution and publication of literature at workshops, in the SFNE newsletter, and on the association's website.

Topics and issues to be covered include:

- ◆ The latest revisions to the publications and standards articulated by the American Institute of Steel Construction (AISC);
- ◆ Matters related to the procurement of structural steel and related products, including steel joists and metal deck, as well as all related materials such as fasteners and welding products;
- ◆ New innovations in equipment or procedures which could enhance the fabrication and utilization of structural and miscellaneous metals;
- ◆ Information pertinent to insurance, business forecasting, project management, safety and other areas which will enhance the bottom line of the membership;
- ◆ Information on legal issues which vitally affect the membership's place in the construction arena; and
- ◆ Information on legislative issues being considered in New England and at the federal level such as Pay When Paid, No Damages for Delay, Indemnification, Prompt Pay, and Retainage.

Golf Classic Committee



SFNE's Golf Classic Committee is responsible for planning the annual tournament.

Their duties include:

- ◆ Developing the agenda and the format;
- ◆ Recommending the prize structure, the raffles, the dates, location and fees; and
- ◆ Registering golfers for the event and the dinner and awards program.
